You will have received a letter from Mrs Baillie regarding reading at Adderley on Wednesday. Chestnut Class News

This week the children in Chestnut Class have explored what it means to be creators. Our learning this half term in RE is centred around who Christians believe made the world and explore this further the children became creators themselves, using clay to mould new animals and plants. As part of this lesson, we discussed the personal qualities needed to be a creator and how these will help us to become creators in the future. In Science, we have observed a tree in our school grounds. This is the start of a yearlong observation which will help the children to learn about the different seasons. The children took leaf samples, made bark rubbings, took photos and even painted pictures of our chosen tree.

What a busy week it has been in Oak Class! I have been really impressed with the amount of effort and energy the children are putting into their learning. In particular, we have some budding actors/actresses who have excelled at role play, bringing to life their literacy work. They have been acting out their own written work from our class book, Queen of the Falls: from reporters flocking to the train station to question the brave Annie, to the devious mind of her suspicious manager, Frank Russell.

To further promote reading, we will be encouraging children, upon finishing a book, to complete an Accelerated Reader test, which will then give a total of the words they have read. A new display is in progress to present the children's achievements based on their totals.

The children have also been helping to come up with ideas to tidy up and improve the areas around the school, to provide more comfortable and accessible reading areas. I am looking forward to help bring these ideas to life!

Willow Class News

This week Willow Class have continued exploring road safety and have been creating role play roads in our outside area and have been practicing these skills using the bikes and scooters.

The children have shown a real interest in our creative area and have been exploring paint using rollers, sponges and brushes to create wonderful patterns and pictures.

In the forest, the children used clay to create models of woodland animals.
