
### **Chestnut Class News**

This week the children in Chestnut class have been exploring the creation story. The children created beautiful zig zag books, illustrating each day from Genesis.

In Literacy, the children have continued to enjoy our story book for this half term- Lost and found. The children have been sequencing the parts of the story and thinking about how each of the characters felt at different points of the story.

In Science, we took our learning into our beautiful forest to help us identify different species of trees and plants. We discussed the difference between deciduous and ever green trees and identified these in our forest, taking samples of leaves and fruit.


In Computing, the children have been practising logging on and accessing their purple mash accounts. Once logged on, the children had lots of fun creating beautiful pictures using the paint functions. Throughout the rest of this half term, we will further explore online safety. Next week we will be sending home your child's Purple Mash login so they can continue to access all these lovely activities at home if they wish.





## Willow Class News

This week children in Willow class have continued to explore the story *Peace at Last*. We have practised bedtime routines creating songs and rhymes to help us remember what we need to do before we go to bed.



In Maths, the children have been looking at pattern and size. The children enjoyed matching the pyjama bottoms and tops with different patterns on them. We have also been ordering teddy bears by size and similarities.

We have also started talking about how the world was created. The children made jelly fish using arts and crafts and asked questions to learn more.



The children have continued to develop their understanding of road safety and made a road role play area using cones, traffic lights and road signs.

## Oak Class News

What another wonderful week we have had in Oak Class! Continuing with our Class Read, *Queen of the Falls*, the children have produced some absolutely super writing about Annie's daring journey along the river, stopping just before she makes the dive over Niagara Falls itself. 


## Other news...
