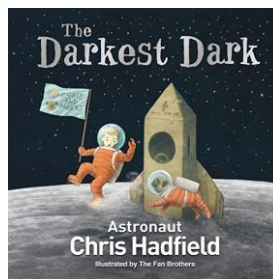
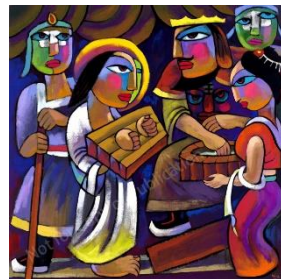
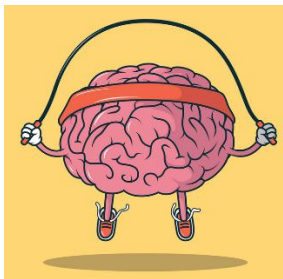
Oak Class

It is wonderful to be back and to begin the new term together. This week, we have started off our new topics of learning with space being the main theme across the curriculum.

This half term we will be really focusing on our own growth mindset and meta cognition.

In literacy, we have started our new book based on the astronaut Chris Hadfield. In Science, the children were fascinated to learn about life on the international space station and we used drama to act out the orbits of the Earth, sun and moon.

As Easter approaches, it is the perfect time to combine our RE learning with Art and Design. In readiness for the Easter Service, the children are going to plan and create their very own piece of art based on work of the Artist He Qi.



Chestnut Class

The Chestnuts have hit the grounds running this week and have been excited to start exploring all our new topics of learning.

In Literacy, we are focusing on poetry and this week the children have learnt a poem called 'At the Zoo' by William Makepeace Thackeray. We have learnt all about rhyming words and the children have even creating their own lines to add to the poem.



In Science, the children planned and took part in a science investigation to explore which materials would be best to make a raincoat for teddy. The children worked in two teams and had to make sure everybody in the team had a job. With their teammates, they then had to carry out the experiment independently. It was wonderful to see the children really working together and supporting each other when problems came up. The children are really starting to understand what it takes to plan a fair test and they are already excited doing it again.

In Art, we have started a unit focusing on drawing skills and mark making. This week we learnt all about the work of the artist Bridget Riley, who cleverly uses different types of lines to create optical illusions. The children experimented with lots of different types of lines and then created their own piece of line art using chalk pens.

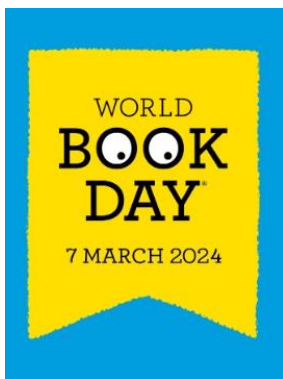
Friendly Friday – Please help!

World Book Day



Our school will be celebrating World Book Day on Thursday 7th March 2023. We have planned some special reading activities to promote reading, share with children what a joy reading can be and remind them how reading can open up new worlds to them.

We feel that the purpose of the day is celebrating the pleasure of reading—so we are asking that children 'come in reading clothes'. This means you can come in school uniform, own clothes, sports gear, pyjamas – or fancy dress if you wish—any clothes will do— as we can read anytime, anywhere!





Healthy School

Over the next couple of weeks, we will be reviewing our Healthy School status and looking at ways that we can improve and support our children, staff and families to make healthy choices.

At playtime we encourage children to bring in healthy snacks that help contribute to their 5 daily portions of fruit and vegetables.

Children in EYFS and KS1 have a daily snack of fruit or veg provided for free by the government, but children are welcome to bring in their own healthy snack of their choice. Milk is free for Nursey and Reception.

Throughout the school day we also encourage our children to stay hydrated and so we would like to remind everyone to bring a water bottle into school daily.

Although we recognise that this cannot be guaranteed, Adderley School aims to be a Nut-Free school. We have introduced measures to reduce the risk to those children and adults who may suffer an anaphylactic reaction if exposed to nuts to which they are sensitive. We ask parents not to include nuts or nut products in school lunch boxes and snacks.

On Monday 18th March we will be holding our termly parents evening. Science Week

Science Week is fast approaching, and excitement is building amongst children and staff. British Science Week is a ten-day celebration with events running throughout the whole of the UK, with the aim of celebrating everything to do with Science, Engineering, Technology and Maths.

As a federation, we will be celebrating British Science week from Monday 4th March to Friday 8th March.

This is a reminder that on Monday 4th March, to kick start the week, we are inviting children to dress up as a Scientist. This could be a decorated t-shirt with scientific vocabulary or diagrams, making a scientific badge to wear for the day or even dressing as a famous Scientist from history.

On Friday 8th March, to round off the week, we would like to invite pupils and their families to take part in science fair. Children are invited to work on a science project of their choice with





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their families at home and present this at our very own Science fair. We hope that children have been excited to start creating their science projects and we can't wait to see what they have come up with.
