Safer Schools - This week myself and Mrs Henney met with Ian Bartlett from Safer Schools to discuss the safety measures at our school and results of our recent Survey that was sent out.

Firstly, I would like to say thank you to all those who participated in the Safer Schools Survey. The response was overwhelmingly positive, with 100% of the respondents stating that they find the school site to be safe, tidy, and welcoming. The feedback also highlighted the general awareness of the school, the maintenance of the premises, and the dedicated efforts to ensure the safety and happiness of the children. We greatly appreciate your support and positive input. So, thank you!

While we are pleased with the positive feedback, we also acknowledge that there are areas in which we can improve. One such area is the need for improved signage. We recognise the importance of clear directions for visitors in order to direct them to the reception area and also for them to look neat and tidy. Rest assured, this is a priority, and we are actively working towards enhancing the signage - it is definitely time for a bit of a refresh!

Additionally, there were mentions of car park safety. Concerns have been raised regarding pupils running unsupervised in the car park. This is concerning to us and therefore Mrs Henney has issued a letter regarding this matter separately.

Moving forward, we are committed to continuing our efforts towards further enhancing safety measures and the overall security of our premises. We will keep you informed of any developments and updates in due course.
