Chestnut Trip to Shrewsbury Museum

On Tuesday 9th April, the children in Chestnut Class went of a very special trip to Shrewsbury Museum. Our literacy topic last half term was based around the beautiful picture book- The Curious Case of the Missing Mammoth- and this visit further enhanced the children's learning and understanding. Despite the torrential rain, we managed to get on the road quickly and the children were very impressed by the cool minibus. When we arrived at the Museum, we were greeted by Hannah who would be taking us on a on a journey through the museum, exploring different eras in History. The children explored the life and work of Charles Darwin and worked as a team to complete a large floor puzzle of his portrait. The children also got to dress up in clothes that would have been worn during this period. We then went further into the museum and the children learnt all about Charles Darwin's adventures and the wonderful bugs and animals he studied. We then travelled back in time to the Ice age, and we learnt all about mammoths and even looked at some bones that have been found in Shropshire. For the main event, the children then took part in a Lego workshop where they were challenged to create a model showing what might happen if the museum came to life at night. The children certainly showed off their wonderful imaginations and creative ideas. After lunch, the weather cleared up, so we thought it was time for a class walk through the Quarry. We had a quick blast on the grass, with a game of hero chicken. We then took a walk by the river, walked across one of the bridges and explored the beautiful Dingle. It was then time to get back to the bus and head back to school.

We are incredibly proud of the children's enthusiasm and behaviour throughout the day. Hannah commented on how wonderful the children's manners were throughout the session.

We are already planning our next adventure!

We have had a very busy time in Oak Class this week. We have begun to delve deeper into the problem of pollution, at the same time as focussing on using subordinating conjunctions to create fantastic complex sentences.
